



OC'S JEWISH COMMUNITY SHINES AT NATIONAL LEGACY GATHERING



In May, the Harold Grinspoon Foundation hosted a Legacy Leadership Gathering in Springfield, MA. The conference brought together lay leaders and professionals from Jewish Community Foundations, synand organizations agogues throughout the country - all meeting together to study and discuss community legacy programs and best practices. With 160 participants from 38 communities, representing more than 80 organizations at the gathering, the North American Jewish community has clearly made great progress in integrating legacy giving into our philanthropic culture.

The conference included personal meetings with Harold Grinspoon and a roundtable discussion on Endowment Book of Life programs led by Foundation Executive Director Wendy Arenson. Other sessions included Donor-Centered Leadership, Creating a Culture of Philanthropy and Working with Professional Advisors led by speakers including Jodi Berman, Penelope Burk, Jerry Posner and Aaron Lansky.

Orange County is at the forefront of this national effort with our Create a Jewish Legacy program started in November 2013. While we began as among the first of seven communities in the program, now 28 communities partner in this inspiring effort. Thanks to those of you who have already joined to create over 350 new legacy gift commitments to ensure a brilliant future for Jewish Orange County, we are a resource for communities throughout the country looking to implement successful legacy programs of their own!
