

2022 GRANTS IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS

COVID-19 RELIEF GRANTS

15 OC Jewish organizations received relief funding to assist with operational costs, financial assistance, educational scholarships, meals, gift packages, and COVID supplies that were distributed to community members throughout Orange County - serving over 4,240 individuals.

COMBATTING ANTISEMITISM

The ADL Orange County mobilized to triage and respond to antisemitic and other hate-related incidents in schools. Incident response activities fall into three intertwined strategies: customized incident response, community engagement/education, and allyship with all our neighbors. With this grant, the ADL engaged **41,813** children, teens, young adults, adults and seniors.

INCIDENT RESPONSE & PREVENTION

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

79 religious school teachers from 9 congregations came together to receive 5 professional development training sessions focused on social, emotional, and spiritual development, growing their understanding of and ability to connect with their students. The collaborative nature of the program opened up this opportunity to an increased number of teachers and benefitted more learners.

4,614 SENIORS

made connections through educational programming, Jewish holiday celebrations, and intergenerational experiences.
