## DWELL Festival: Harvest, Welcome, Gather

## A VIBRANT SUKKOT CELEBRATION


On October 20th, the Foundation's Weissman Arts program partnered with The Ecology Center to host DWELL Festival: Harvest, Welcome, Gather – A Sukkot Experience, celebrating the rich traditions of Sukkot with over 1,200 guests from across Southern California. Together, we embraced the beauty of community, creativity, and connection to the land, all while honoring the Jewish harvest festival and its timeless values.

Against the stunning backdrop of autumn on the farm, attendees immersed themselves in **42 interactive experiences** that brought ancient traditions to life. Guests explored hands-on workshops like dill pickle making, kombucha demos, floral arranging, and nature crafts. Joyful drum circles and engaging farm tours added rhythm and movement to the day, while gardening panels, environmental educational panels, and experiences in architect-designed sukkot highlighted the interplay of art, sustainability, and Jewish heritage.

At the heart of the Festival stood the DWELL Design Challenge, a creative showcase that reimagined the sukkah—an iconic structure symbolizing hospitality and gratitude. Inspired by biblical guidelines and modern architectural ingenuity, five innovative designs took shape, brought to life by talented teams from Lehrer Architects LA, Petersen & Gottelier, SC Builders & Teale Architecture, and The Ecology Center. These sukkot served not only as shelters, but as vibrant expressions of our cultural emphasis on gathering together in celebration of community, artistic imagination, and sustainability, embodying the spirit of Sukkot in fresh and exciting ways.

This Festival wouldn't have been possible without the enduring legacy of Albert and Rhoda Yvette Weissman, whose generous bequest established the Weissman Arts program. Their gift continues to infuse Jewish and greater Orange County with inspiring Jewish arts and cultural programming, bringing us together in meaningful ways.
