LIVING THEIR VALUES: **AN ENDURING GIFT TO JEWISH ORANGE COUNTY**

Meet Ken & Nancy

For more than five decades, Ken and Nancy Levin have helped shape Jewish life in Orange County, weaving together community, leadership, and legacy.

Ken's Jewish journey began when a scholarship to Camp Ramah showed him the life-changing impact of charitable giving, and continued through his active involvement in Hillel at UCLA where he received a BA (Hebrew, Psychology) followed by a MSW (SDSU). In 1971, he became the first Executive Director of the Jewish Federation of Orange County, working with Nancy to strengthen Jewish life when the community had only a few congregations.



Nancy, who holds advanced degrees in secular education (SDSU) and Jewish education (Hebrew Union College, LA), devoted her career to inspiring generations of Jewish learners. Serving as the Educational Director at several congregations, including Temple Sharon (Costa Mesa), Temple Shir Ha-Ma'alot (Irvine), and Kehillat Israel (Pacific Palisades), she shared her passion for learning, connection, and continuity.

Together, the Levins championed global Jewish causes—from advocating for Soviet and Ethiopian Jewry to organizing Orange County's first Israel Fair in 1973. Their leadership and example have inspired countless others to give, volunteer, and lead.

Now enjoying retirement in Laguna Woods, the Levins remain active volunteers and lifelong learners, participating in Jewish cultural life, including JCFOC-hosted site visits to OC Hillel, UCI Chabad, and City of Hope, that give JCFOC fund holders exclusive access to local nonprofits and meaningful opportunities to engage. The Levins use their JCFOC Donor Advised Philanthropic Fund to support numerous causes in Orange County and beyond.

The Levins also chose to establish their legacy of giving through an Endowment Fund at the Jewish Community Foundation Orange County. "We had always given Jewishly," Nancy shared, "but aligning our philanthropy with the Foundation meant our impact could be rooted here and extend outward."

Through their Donor Advised Philanthropic Fund, the Levins are able to meaningfully and strategically support the causes that matter most to them. With their Endowment Fund, they ensure that their enduring values, community, education, Israel and tikkun olam, will continue to enrich Jewish life for generations to come.
